We did manage to sell a little of the wine over the last few years. We enjoyed visits by Dave Cofran to Arizona and in turn we enjoyed our visits there. In the last year or two, John Johnson retired leaving Dave Cofran to maintain the vineyard, make and sell the wine. Finally, they decided to close down the whole operation. I received a letter to that effect this week. I called Dave and we talked about how it had come to this and how bad the economy was. Then he mentioned that he was sitting on a lanai in Kauai. Things didn't seem so awful after all. I told him that Laurie and I had not been there since we started Orangewood Wines...
